**5. MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Vice Mayor McDonald reported on the following:

- Upcoming 34<sup>th</sup> Anniversary for the City of Thorne Bay. McDonald stated there would be a parade around town lead by Amy McDonald. McDonald stated motorcycles would be included in the parade in memory of Swede Ecklund.
- City is in the process of trying to acquire the Sort Yard Lands from the USFS, currently asking for help with the funding from Senator Murkowski. The City currently has a call into the USFS to find out what they are asking for the Sort Yard.
- Update on Judge George's Orders for the current lawsuit between the City of Thorne Bay and Guy Lane.

**6. CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:**

The City Clerk gave the Administrator Report in the absence of City Administrator Wayne Benner.

## **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT for 7-19-16 read by Teri Feibel**

### **Report:**

Mayor Gould sent a letter to congressional delegations requesting the FS transfer all of the Sort Yard over to the City of Thorne Bay as part of the land exchange legislation that is being proposed. –Chuck Kleeschulte, a staffer at the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee in Washington, responded to the letter upon request of Senator Murkowski, and spoke with Vice Mayor McDonald. Mr. Kleeschulte requested information on the amount of acres the city was hoping to buy and estimate of likely appraised value of the property. Vice Mayor McDonald met with Scott Leslie with the USFS to further discuss the Sort Yard acreage and price. Mr. Leslie contacted Hillary Woods of the USFS to gather the information Vice Mayor McDonald requested, and was informed she was out of the office. Mr. Leslie stated he would be unable to get the information on the Sort Yard until Ms. Woods return to work in August.

### **City Clerk Notes:**

- HUGE THANK YOU to Sky Orbendorfer who has taken it upon herself to fill in the potholes in the Subdivision. She has been out with a shovel the last few days working hard.
- Elections October 4, 2016. Two council seats – Ray Slayton Seat (A) and Risa Carlson Seat (B) – Application for candidacy period is August 15 through September 2<sup>nd</sup>. Mon-Thurs 9-4 and Friday 9-12, applications are not accepted on weekends or holidays. One ballot question: "**shall Resolution number 15-09-01-01, which amended Resolutions 13-07-02-02, 09-11-30-03 and 09-01-20-01, titled Fee Schedule for Fire and EMS Departments be repealed?**"

### **FYI:**

The Alaska House of Representatives on Friday adjourned the fifth special session without taking any action on the Governors new tax measures which included: implementing income, sales, motor fuel, mining, alcohol, tobacco and fisheries taxes; and Permanent Fund restructuring legislation.

### **New Business:**

Lavenia Sylvia contacted councilmember Hartwell by email to ask if one or more councilmembers could sponsor a zone change in her area to remove industrial use. The area is zoned Residential/Commercial III. 17.04.026 Mixed residential/commercial III. The purpose of this zone is to be as open and unrestrictive as possible by allowing many different, compatible uses, yet still provide protection to all property owners in the subdivision. Section 15.04.020 stipulates that "Development Plans" are required of all building to make the public aware of setback requirements and eliminate building encroachments into right-of-way, easements and other properties.

- A. The code outlines the process for rezoning or amending zoning title.

Three ways to initiate rezone:

1. City Council on its own motion with planning commission recommendation
2. Planning Commission on its own motion with city council approval
3. By petition signed by 60% of the property owners within the zoning area of proposed change or rezone

After review of the Thorne Bay Municipal Code, it appears that the appropriate action to take would be to have Mrs. Sylvia or any other interested property owner sponsor a petition that will need to be signed by 60% of the property owners within the zoning area of proposed change or rezone since the request was from a property owner and not a member of PZ or Council.

B. Resolution 16-19-07-01 expressing urgency for Alaska State Legislature to pass all necessary fiscal legislation required to provide fair, balanced and sustainable State Budget. This was received from AML upon request of the Governor's office. AML advised the municipalities that each community could chose to ignore the resolution if they chose to and AML did not send because they supported it. It is on the agenda for you to review and decide if you support it or not.

**Harbors:** Summer is in full swing and we have many transient visitors occupying the harbor.

**Streets and Roads:** Max is back from vacation and working on fixing the broken city equipment. Excavator loss of power in hydraulic system, tailgate on small garbage truck had been ripped off. The guys were able to fix the equipment with exception of the excavator, they need mechanic to fix that.

**Water and Sewer:** Jason and Sam working on daily water/sewer operations

**Solid Waste:** The yearly inspection of the solid waste site is scheduled for this month, Max and Josh have been making sure everything is in order for the inspection. Figure tomorrow or next Wednesday for that.

**Law Enforcement:** Buck Bazinet is back from training and working.

**Parks and Recreation:** Johnathon Jennings submitted his resignation. Last day of work is July 21, 2016. At this time I do not see a need to advertise this position, and will distribute duties in house. If there is a need to advertise and hire another employee, Wayne will do so when he returns.

**Library:** Summer Reading Program is currently running, Mark or Lana may speak more on that if they chose under public comment.

7. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Mark Lisowski commented on the following:

- Summer Teen and Children's Reading Program going on at the Library, will end on August 27<sup>th</sup>
- Working on CCR Grant for Career College Readiness, the grant will bring in professionals to help the middle school children with college readiness

Bob Hartwell stated the Fishing Derby would be holding a dinner at the High school on July 30<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm. The grand prize will be a motor, and you must be present to win.

McDonald moved to discuss the request for the City Council to sponsor a zone change or rezone of Residential/Commercial III Zoning, and review the procedure for title amendments including rezone under Thorne Bay Municipal Code 17.04.045. Carlson seconded the motion. Gould stated he felt the appropriate action would be for the property owners to submit a petition for the zone amendment or rezone. Hartwell stated he was concerned that if the council sponsored the change, it could lead to legal problems for the City from property owners who may have purchased their property strictly because of the zoning. There was further discussion. Gould instructed the City Clerk to notify the property owner who requested the change in zoning, to follow the petition process outlined in the Thorne Bay Municipal Code if they wish to proceed with the amendment or rezone.

McDonald stated the resolution may be considered later if the Legislature calls for another special session, but since the Legislature had adjourned the 5<sup>th</sup> special session in July without action, there was no need to proceed right now.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF THORNE BAY, ALASKA, RETAINING THE CONSULTING SERVICES OF DOWL FOR DESIGN AND OTHER ENGINEERING SERVICES RELATED TO THE VILLAGE SAFE WATER PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the City Council is the governing body for the City of Thorne Bay, Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the City of Thorne Bay has qualified for a grant from State of Alaska Village Safe Water for water and sewer improvements, and

WHEREAS, the City hired DOWL to assist with consulting, permitting, engineering and contract administration in 2011 for the Davidson Landing Harbor Facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City solicited for Engineering/Planning Requests for Qualifications (RFQ) in the spring of 2012; and

WHEREAS, the City Administrator, after review of the RFQs submitted, recommended to the City Council the consulting firm of DOWL be hired to assist with specific engineering projects; and

WHEREAS, at the August 21, 2012 City Council meeting, the Council selected "DOWL for their engineering consultant for future projects"; and

WHEREAS, DOWL has assisted the City of Thorne Bay with planning, engineering, grants and project administration since February 2011 in good standing; and

WHEREAS, DOWL has provided assistance with, including grant submittal, to include nearly 3 million in grant funds that have been awarded to the City; and

WHEREAS, DOWL prepared the Design Study Report (2016) and the Preliminary Engineering Report (2015), that were the basis for the City's request to Village Safe Water for funding for projects to Reduce Disinfection Byproducts and Disinfect Wastewater Treatment Facility Effluent; and

WHEREAS, DOWL is very familiar with the City's infrastructure and utility operations and has an excellent working relationship with local, state and federal agencies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the City of Thorne Bay hereby retains the consulting services of DOWL for design and other engineering services related to the Village Safe Water projects, and will not consider use of any other engineering firm in Thorne Bay.

ORDINANCE 16-09-06-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF THORNE BAY,  
ALASKA, AMENDING TITLE 2-ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL, CHAPTER  
2.24-OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES, SECTION 2.24.090-COMPENSATION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF THORNE BAY, ALASKA

- Section 1. Classification. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature, the chapter and section hereby amended shall be added to the Thorne Bay Municipal Code.
- Section 2. Severability. If any provisions of this ordinance or any application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the circumstances shall not be affected thereby.
- Section 3. Amendment of Chapter. Amending Chapter 2.24-Officers and Employees, Section 2.24.090-Compensation, is hereby added
- Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.

**Chapter 2.24**  
**OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES**

**2.24.090 Compensation.**

C. Overtime.

~~1. Employees who work over forty hours per week or eight hours per day shall be compensated at the rate of one and one-half their hourly rate.~~

**1. Employees who work over forty hours per week shall be compensated at the rate of one and one-half their hourly rate unless otherwise exempt under the Federal Labor Standards Act.**

**Alaska Minimum Wage and Overtime Exemptions** - the following are not required to receive minimum wage or overtime under the Alaska Wage and Hour Act:

7. Any individual employed by the United States, State or local government (i.e. Political Subdivision)

Although individuals employed by the United States, State or Local Governments, are exempt from Alaska State Minimum Wage and Overtime Laws, they are NOT exempt from Federal Labor Standards Act.

The federal **overtime** provisions are contained in the **Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA)**. Unless exempt, employees covered by the Act must receive **overtime** pay for hours worked over 40 in a workweek at a rate not less than time and one-half their regular rates of pay.

Exemptions from the Overtime Requirement in the FLSA that apply to the City of Thorne Bay at this time:

***Exemptions from Both Minimum Wage and Overtime Pay***

1. Executive, administrative, and professional employees (including teachers and academic administrative personnel in elementary and secondary schools), outside sales employees, and employees in certain computer-related occupations (as defined in DOL regulations);

This exemption only applies to two employees of the City at this time.

All other employees will be compensated at 1.5 times their hourly rate for any time worked over 40 hours in one week.
