 - * Three Judges are needed for the Polls in City Hall beginning at 7:30am until 9:00pm
- Davidson Landing Fire Hall, South Thorne Bay
 - * <u>**Two Absentee Officials**</u> are needed for the Absentee Voting at Davidson Landing from 7:30am until 8:30pm

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Applicants must be registered to vote in the City of Thorne Bay.
- Applicants must be able to work all day on Tuesday, October 1, 2019, starting at 7:30 a.m. Until the votes are tallied after the polls close at 8:00 p.m.
- Candidates for office and their immediate family members (parents, spouse, children, and siblings) shall not serve as judges.

- Submit an application for Election Worker to be considered for election judge to: City Clerk, City of Thorne Bay, P.O. Box 19110, Thorne Bay, AK 99919

 - Pay will be \$12 to \$15 per hour for Election Judges. Breaks will be provided.

NOTICE OF REGULAR ELECTION

TO BE HELD: October 1, 2019

FOR THE PURPOSE OF FILLING THREE (3) VACANT SEATS ON THE THORNE BAY CITY COUNCIL.

SEAT: A 3-YEAR TERM – Term expires in 2022 (Currently held by Raymond Slayton) SEAT: B 3-YEAR TERM – Term expires in 2022 (Currently held by Risa Carlson) SEAT: C 2-YEAR TERM – Term expires in2021 (Currently held by Mark Minnillo who was appointed to replace elected Councilman Robert Hartwell)

QUALIFICATIONS:

A person filing for election to a seat on the governing body must be:

- A United States citizen who is qualified to vote in state elections;
- A resident of Thorne Bay for thirty days immediately preceding the election for which declaring candidacy;
- Registered to vote in state elections;
- Not disqualified under Article V of the Constitution of the State of Alaska which provides that:

No person may vote who has been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude unless his civil rights have been restored or judicially determined to be of unsound mind unless reversed.

FILING FOR OFFICE:

Any person who wishes to become a candidate for an elective office shall complete and file with the Municipal Clerk a declaration of candidacy. This shall be filed **no sooner than 50 days** and **no later than 30 days** before the election. Any candidate wishing to withdraw his/her candidacy may do so no later than the last day for filing a declaration of candidacy (30 days before the election) by filing a written notice of withdrawal with the Municipal Clerk.

Candidates for office must file a declaration of candidacy with the Municipal Clerk not earlier than **MONDAY AUGUST 12, 2019**, and not later than **12:00 p.m., FRIDAY AUGUST 30, 2019**.
