Location: Sullivan Arena Parking Lot - 1600 Gambell St Anchorage, AK 99501

This is an opportunity for Transitioning Service Members, Veterans, Guard and Reserves who are interested in becoming a commercial driver. Student will learn the fundamentals of driving a tractor-trailer and get industry experience. Once student has passed the road test at the end of class they will be able to walk away with their commercial drivers license. Selection for the class will be for 6 individuals and will require an interview for selection between December 3rd - 7th, 2018.

Cost to selected students will be \$15 to DMV for permit fee and \$100 to DMV for Licensing fee for a total cost of \$115. All other cost will be paid by Alaska Works Partnership.

- Must be able to PASS Drug and Alcohol Screening test and DOT Physical to obtain Physical Card (these test will be paid for by AWP)
