A resolution to indicate the City Council's desire to apply for a grant from the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities for the funding of a transportation study in and near the City of Thorne Bay and what effect the present services have on the welfare of the residents and the economy.

WHEREAS: The newly incorporated City of Thorne Bay is the site of a former privately owned logging camp on federal land; and,

WHEREAS: the road system was designed and built to accomodate large, heavy duty, industrial logging trucks and is not suited for small privately owned vehicles; and,

WHEREAS: the Alaska Marine Highway System is accessible to the residents of Thorne Bay only at Hollis, Alaska which is at the end of a sixty mile journey over poorly maintained roads; and,

WHEREAS: there is no airport at or near the City of Thorne Bay therefore the shipment of goods and passenger travel is limited due to the reduced capacity of float equipped aircraft being the only type of plane that can land near the City; and,

WHEREAS: about ninety (90) percent of the land area within the corporate limites of the City cannot be reached by road transportation from the City Hall; and,

WHEREAS: there is no public owned dock or wharf at which general cargo and passengers may be landed; and,

WHEREAS: there is no Federal Aviation Administration recognized and licensed heliport at Thorne Bay; and,

WHEREAS: the health and welfare of the residents of Thorne Bay is jeopardized because no medical assistance can be obtained during a period of inclement weather and the development of a sound economy is limited due to an inadequate transportation system; and,

WHEREAS: the unemployment rate is now at about fifty (50) percent due to the poor economy; and,

WHEREAS: tourism, a large and labor intensive industry, is all

but nonexistent in Thorne Bay due to a poor or remote transportation system to serve the City; and,

WHEREAS: the City of Thorne Bay is financially unable to fund a transportation study to determine the effects of the existing transportation system from its own resources; and,

WHEREAS: the State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities has grant funds available for transportation studies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Thorne Bay shall apply for a grant from the State of Alaska to fund a transportation study which will determine the effects of inadequate or nonexistent transportation systems and to determine what additions, changes and modernizations are necessary to bring the transportation facilities and services on a par with other cities in Southeast Alaska.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the goal of a transportation study shall be to improve the health and welfare of the residents and to emphasize the improvement of the economy of the City of Thorne Bay, Alaska.

- WHEREAS, a study of the general transportation needs of the City is now in progress; and,
- WHEREAS, funding from the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities for the general transportation study is not sufficient to include a comprehensive study of the deep water port site; and,
- WHEREAS, the health, safety and general welfare of the people of Thorne Bay would be substantially improved if a deep water port were available but the suitability of a port site cannot be determined unless a detailed study is funded and conducted.

WHEREAS, the newly occupied area on the South side of the Bay is within the corporate limits of the City of Thorne Bay, the City has an obligation to provide certain services to the residents of that area; and,

WHEREAS, with no connecting road, the residents of the South side of the bay have to take their children in small open skiffs, across the open water of the bay, and after launching the small craft from a rocky beach, regardless of weather, darkness or tidal conditions; and

WHEREAS, because there are no road links, the City cannot provide fire protection or ambulance service to the clinic or police protection because the South side of the bay is accessible only by small boat; and,



- WHEREAS, The small boath harbor and airplane float on the North side of Thorne Bay are privately owned by Louisiana-Pacific and are in dire need of repair; and,
- WHEREAS, The residents of South Thorne Bay have no docking facilities on that side of the municipality of Thorne Bay, creating a boating safety hazard; and,
- WHEREAS, The City of Thorne Bay has no bulk fuel storage and currently purchases fuel from the Louisiana Pacific Corporation at inflated costs; and,
- WHEREAS, The City of Thorne Bay has hosted the Prince of Wales Island Fair for the past seven years; and,
- WHEREAS, The Prince of Wales Island Fair has grown into an annual event; and,
- WHEREAS, The City of Thorne Bay has minimal and unsafe facilities for this event; and,



WHEREAS, The existing power plant for the City has been rebuilt and is at the end of its life expectancy and the City has no backup power.



RESOLUTION 83-12-15-01

A Resolution of the City Council
of the City of Thorne Bay, Alaska Requesting
Funding from the State of Alaska

- WHEREAS, The City of Thorne Bay, Alaska did become an incorporated city of the second class under Alaska State Laws on August 2, 1982; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Thorne Bay did purchase the Electric Utility from the former owner of the logging camp of Thorne Bay, the Louisiana-Pacific Corporation; and,
- WHEREAS, the City has been successful in paying all of the costs of the Electric Utility except \$110,000.00 as of December 1, 1983, and this balance due is carrying an interest charge of about \$1,046.00 per month; and,
- WHEREAS, the existing generation equipment of the Electric Utility is not sufficient to produce enough power to fill the expected demands in the near future and the Electric Utility does not have generating equipment for back-up in case of an equipment failure, and,
- WHEREAS, the main generator that is now in use has only about six (6) months of useful life remaining; and,
- WHEREAS, the City will be required to supply power to the Forest Service quarters, that are to be constructed during the summer of 1984 and the probability that the City will provide power to the State of Alaska Land Disposal Area on the South Side of Thorne Bay in the near future, the present equipment is not capable of responding to these demands; and
- WHEREAS, the cost of operation of the Electric Utility is not paid from tax monies but from user fees and charges; and,
- WHEREAS, to finance the remaining principle of this debt and to purchase the needed equipment and systems improvements at a lower rate of interest than is now being paid and over a longer period of time will relieve the residence of the City of this avoidable burden especially during these times of a depressed economy in the City; and
- WHEREAS, The State of Alaska, through the Alaska Power Authority, has a program for financing Electric Utility Systems and Equipment purchases and this program is authorized in Alaska Statute 44.83.170.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Thorne Bay, Thorne Bay, Alaska that a request be made to the Alaska Power Authority to submit a request to the Alaska State Legislature for a Supplemental Appropriation in the sum of \$275,000.00 which will be used to pay off the balance due on the purchase of the Electric Utility from the Louisiana-Pacific Corporation and to purchase a 450KW Generator and to make upgrades to the electrical system and Powerhouse.
