Thorne Bay Election Results

Congratulations to Robert Hartwell and Charles Jennings on their new term of office.

Elections were held on October 4th this year to vote on two city council seats and one ballot initiative. The Council certified the October Election at their regular meeting held on October 10th.

With a vote of 81, Robert Hartwell was elected to Seat A for term of three years and with 69 votes, Charles Jennings was elected to Seat B for a term of three years. The Ballot Initiative to set a term limit on the Offices of City Council passed by two votes with a vote of 53/51.

Effective October 11th, 2022. a councilmember may not serve more than six consecutive years in office.

With this Term Limit, we will need more voters to step up and serve on the Council for Thorne Bay. The City Council is comprised of Seven registered voters of Thorne Bay with the Mayor being elected from existing councilmembers by the voters.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S OCTOBER REPORT

- City will be installing the "NO PARKING" signs along southside roads for snow plowing season.
 We expect to put them up prior to November 1st, along with a few speed limit signs.
- Administrator has been working on several grant possibilities for the Kasaan Access Road and will continue working on those for the foreseeable future. Some of the most promising opportunities are through the Tribal Transportation Program administered by OVK.
- AP&T Broadband submarine fiber optic cable is going to be landing in Coffman Cove around the 29th or 30th of October.
- We will preparing for winter plowing and sanding the next couple of weeks, hauling sand to Solid Waste and the City Shop so it is ready for

- ready for wintertime snow and ice.
 City Hall continues to have issues with the roof leaking in the Clinic restroom ceiling. We will get that taken care of ASAP.
- Rock blasting at landfill is complete, but the crushing has been delayed by 3 weeks due to unforeseen slides in the Juneau area requiring the unexpected services of our contractor.
- The Kasaan Road Intersection RAC Project -AP&T will be moving their power poles once we level of the rock and add more of the rock fill.
- Kasaan Road 3 Mile Hill We had 3 weeks into that project, and although budgeted for 8 weeks, we got a late start and are running short of time. We will not likely get anymore done this year.
- Old Fire Hall Cleanup delayed until springtime.

WINTER TIPS FOR KEEPING YOUR WATER PIPES FROM FREEZING



Winter is coming and so is the risk of frozen pipes. As soon as thermometers drop into the freezing zone, the following tips will help you avoid unpleasant surprises that may come from broken water pipes on your property.

Follow these steps to help prevent frozen water pipes.

- 1) Keep Water Flowing If any of your indoor faucets are located on exterior walls that aren't adequately insulated, set your faucets to a slow drip whenever temperatures dip well below freezing. This is usually necessary only during especially bitter cold spells. Faucets and pipes located along exterior walls are especially susceptible to freezing. For maximum effectiveness, make sure both the hot and cold lines are opened slightly since both are vulnerable. Also, consider leaving cabinet doors open so your pipes will be warmed from the room air.
- 2) **Disconnect and drain garden hoses.** Disconnect and drain the garden hose connection. This will help prevent outside faucets and pipes from freezing, leaking or breaking.
- 3) **Cover exposed pipes** (both indoors and out) with insulating foam covers or heating tape. Close outside vents, crawl spaces and doors so cold air doesn't seep inside.
- 4) Locate The Shut-off Valves. Place a tag on the main shut-off valve. Make sure everyone in the house knows where it is and how to operate it in an emergency.


