- 5) MAYOR'S REPORT:
 - a) Playground is finished and we have seen 12-20 kids already out there playing.
- 6) ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

- 8) PUBLIC COMMENTS:
 - a) **Sean Kaer** commented: Awesome that we got a grant for sewage, hopefully it addresses runoff and business
 - i. Voting at Davidson Landing is important, and it is needed. Every Citizen has a right to vote and be heard.
 - b) **Thom Cunningham** commented: Attempted to arrange meetings with city officials and wasn't able to.
 - i. Ludacris to get rid of DL polls for a few people who don't want to drive to DL.
 - ii. Firehall (million-dollar monstrosity) If it is built, property taxes will be instituted. I submitted a floor plan that was approved and it should have stayed within those drawings. Why does it take so long to get signs up, parts are sitting there, nothing is up. Amy Jennings put up signs and elevated stop signs and that's it.
 - iii. City did not purchase playground equipment from James Stevens.

9) COUNCIL COMMENTS:

- Oatman commented:
 - o DL voting was not intended to take away anyone's voting right.
 - o The playground got voted down because someone didn't want the berry bushes to be removed.
- **Burger** commented: Amy was involved in the DL playground and letters were sent to Southside and there were people who opposed because of the berry picking.
- Oatman commented that Friends have a plan over there.
- Burger clarified that it was Mr. Bob Cunninghams
- **Stram** recalled that when the issue of DL came up, always in favor for voting out there and I believe that I spoke up in favor. At the meetings we had, no one spoke up in favor of continuing to have voting out there yet several people from Goose Creek did not want to have to drive to DL or vote Absentee. I was outvoted.
- **Hartwell** recollected there was a problem getting volunteers to man the place over there for the voting stations. It was easier and it was cheaper to eliminate it.

- a) Thom Cunningham commented on the DL voting issue, the word was not out well enough that there was a meeting, and it was in Jan when the roads were bad. The agendas that I have picked up at DL are not always the same as the ones handed out here.
 - i. There is a picture of Charlie Brown with no information on him. DOB, KIA, and location of his Vietnam memorial. Expressed displeasure of Huestis
 - ii. Goose Creek people may have been misinformed that the state was forcing them to go there.
- b) Sean Kaer commented that packets have not been available or updated at DL.
- c) VPSO Mendonsa thanked for the extra effort and does not see a divide between the sides. I offer to bring packets to DL and
 - i. reported that extra effort is being made to make sure that loading and unloading of kids from the bus to ensure safety.
 - Speed limit sign for the school zones recommended relatively cheap cost.
 - ii. We have certified 2 new drives for Ambulance drivers, many people are interested in signing up.
 - iii. Will West has taken on Fire Chief and is doing great. Several people are interested in signing up and have started training already.
 - iv. Joined the Island wide training at Votech, TB represented the majority of the involvement.
 - v. Pulled out 5,000lbs of garbage from Seaford's Pit.
 - vi. 3 arrests, 25 incidents.
- d) Sean Kaer Victoria was awesome on the call that I witnessed. Great job by EMS.
- e) Thom Cunningham Individual living at Seaford's pit who has done a great job cleaning up the garbage. City should have followed Bob Hartwell's recommendation to push the cars to the back.

- a) Hartwell commented that it was mentioned that we weren't available for a meeting, and we came in early for that meeting and Mr. Cunningham was never showed.

RESOLUTION 22-10-09-01 CITY OF THORNE BAY

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF THORNE BAY CERTIFYING THE ELECTION RESULTS AND ALL PROCEEDINGS IN THE OCTOBER 3, 2023, REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, the City Council is the governing body for the City of Thorne Bay, Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the City held a Regular Municipal Election on October 3, 2023, for the purpose of filling three (3) vacant council seats; and

WHEREAS, notice of the City Election was duly given per the Thorne Bay Municipal Code Chapter 2.28-Elecitons; and

WHEREAS, the City Council received from the City Clerk, a Canvass Report and Certificate of Results of the Regular Election ("Certificate of Election"); and

WHEREAS, there were a total of one hundred and twenty-six (126) votes cast and one hundred twenty-two votes were counted during the October 3, 2023, Regular Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF THORNE BAY DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE AND CERTIFY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the minutes of the October 9th, 2023, Council Meeting, reflect that the City Council certified the Election Results, reflecting a total of 126 votes cast, and one-hundred and twenty-two votes were counted and reflected in the Certificate of the Election.

Section 2. Max Blair is Elected to Seat B, for a Two-year Term with a total of 90 votes, Tiana LaVoie is Elected to Seat C, for a Three-year Term, with a total of 96 votes, Sean Kaer is Elected to Seat E, for a Three-year Term, with a total of 67 votes.

Section 3. That all proceedings in connection with the Regular Municipal Election have been accomplished according to law and the City Clerk is, hereby authorized and directed to deliver, or arrange for delivery of, a copy of the Certificate of Election to each newly elected councilmember.
